<b>Bees for Development</b>	Sustainable Livelihoods	Ethiopia Ghana Uganda	COVID-19 in Africa is causing urban people to become unemployed and return to rural areas, creating a surge in demand for our training services. We urgently need this online platform for us and our partners in Africa to scale up to efficiently deliver far more, high quality beekeeping training.	<b>£13,944.40</b>
<b>Breathe Creative</b>	Lifelong Learning	Kenya	Make It Happen - Funding support will be used to purchase and distribute basic food stuffs, soap and sanitisers, during the Covid 19 Pandemic to support Maasai widows and girls near Narok, Kenya, to address extreme food shortages due to the closure of local livestock markets.	<b>£3,167.40</b>

<b>CEMPOP-Cardiff</b>	Health	Uganda	Project Buyonjo initiated construction and deployment of 54 hand sanitizer stations in Budaka district, Uganda, as a community-led response to COVID-19. Funding is urgently required to maintain local production of sanitizer gel, to expand the network of free-to-use stations, and to promote the role of hand hygiene in controlling infection.	<b>£14,986.00</b>
<b>ChallengeAid</b>	Health	Kenya	Upgrading of sanitation and washing stations in 24 schools of hope in Kenya.	<b>£16,582.95</b>
<b>Chomuzangari Women's Cooperative</b>	Sustainable Livelihoods	Zimbabwe	We will supply our partner, Hope Foundation, and the community in Chomuzangari village with computers and internet access. This will support the development of our partnership working and will provide internet access to local women and young people. We will support Covid prevention through providing PPE, sanitation materials and information.	<b>£12,660.00</b>
<b>Dolen Cymru Wales Lesotho Link</b>	Health	Lesotho	A team of lead teachers will create digital resources to support a literacy catch up programme for use in and outside of school. School support will also be developed to assist new WASH practices and learner well-being support once schools are safe to open in Lesotho.	<b>£14,996.90</b>
<b>Giakonda Solar Schools</b>	Lifelong Learning	Zambia	We will equip 14 rural schools in Zambia to open safely by providing health and hygiene resources to protect against transmission of COVID. We will install mobile broadband to support the remote working of our partnership with them and enable an increased amount of online teacher training.	<b>£5,184.00</b>
<b>Hands Around The World</b>	Sustainable Livelihoods	Zambia	Our two partner projects in Zambia, a large community school (Monze) and a vocational training Centre (Chisamba) are in need of additional urgent support this year due to the demands and challenges of COVID-19. This funding will cover essential PPE needs, urgent food requirements, staff training and much-needed communication costs.	<b>£5,678.85</b>

<b>Hay2Timbuktu</b>	Lifelong Learning and Health	Mali	Radio messages to reengage students, particularly girls in school to avoid an upsurge in dropout rates. Training for girls and mothers to mitigate and reduce gender based violence and to encourage women and girls to lead and participate in Covid 19 response planning and decision making. Essential equipment for women working in CSCOMS (clinics) to support women and girls to reengage with services.	<b>£8,131.00</b>
<b>Hazina</b>	Health	Tanzania	To enable and strengthen the capacity of the Primary Health Care Providers to be able to deliver essential mental health care services, including prevention of and protection from COVID 19, to individuals with mental illness in the community in Zanzibar.	<b>£8,019.00</b>
<b>Life for African Mothers</b>	Health	Liberia	To mitigate the impact of Covid-19 on 3 slum communities in Monrovia, Liberia, through an information campaign which will inform the population of how to protect themselves and each other; and through action to support 150 of the most vulnerable pregnant women and nursing mothers with hygiene kits and food.	<b>£14,559.35</b>
<b>Love Zimbabwe</b>	Lifelong Learning	Zimbabwe	We will empower the community through making the internet accessible in the village for the first time. We will install an internet hub at the library, build an open sided communications hut, install electricity and phone line, provide computers for community use and train locals in how to use them.	<b>£14,680.00</b>
<b>Mothers of Africa</b>	Health and Lifelong Learning	Zambia	In rural Zambian communities, people do not believe that COVID-19 is real and vaccination resistance is huge generally. This will inevitably cause considerable preventable morbidity and many deaths. This funding will enable crucial health information to be delivered to communities and behaviour change by: Understanding perceptions of recipients; Producing tailored visual messages; Engaging communities.	<b>£6,940.00</b>

<b>Niokolo Network</b>	Lifelong Learning	Senegal	Senegal is currently experiencing a rapid increase in daily Covid-19 cases. This project will deliver a nation-wide information campaign using local-language films to combat the spread of the virus. At the same time a range of digital tools will be used to take a more targeted approach within our partner villages to deliver sustained health messaging and to adapt our ongoing educational activities to the Covid-19 era.	<b>£7,336.00</b>
<b>Swansea Bay Health Charity</b>	Health	Liberia	The funding will be used to procure essential medication and nutritional supplies to strengthen the inpatient and outpatient feeding units in the Integrated Management of Acute Malnutrition (IMAM) partnership between the Ministry of Health and the ELWA hospital, Monrovia. Funding will also be used for refresher training for staff involved.	<b>£14,950.00</b>
<b>Treeflights Ltd</b>	Sustainable Livelihoods	Kenya	Funding will set up a Community Internet Hub at our Community Forest Centre to enable digitally excluded young people to connect to the Web for educational and employment opportunities, to improve connectivity of the Center for marketing purposes and to facilitate communication between African and Welsh arms of our Community Carbon Link.	<b>£4,063.00</b>
<b>Zimbabwe Newport Volunteering Association</b>	Health and Lifelong learning	Zimbabwe	For continuity & sustainability of phase 1 of WG Emergency Respond covid-19 grant. The grant will used to buy food items for 10 community kitchens, sanitizers for 18 stations, PPE for volunteers and volunteer expenses while Combating misinformation about virus transmission, prevention and treatment methods.	<b>£7,800.00</b>
