Previous projects have enabled 11 teachers to become Jolly Phonics Trainers and 3 facilitators to become Resilience Trainers. We would like to fund them to continue their professional development over the next 12 months. This will include supporting the Literacy trainers to ensure the country wide roll out of Jolly Phonics is sustainable.
