Association of Chairs	Our aim is to establish a volunteer network of peer support for Chairs and Vice Chairs in Wales. Chairing is a demanding and often lonely role. We'll be working to recruit, train and develop Chairs to support others in chairing roles.	£47,243.86
Ategi	Ategi will set up 6 locality based groups of volunteers with additional needs in Rhondda Cynon Taff. They will provide voluntary peer support to each other, building on their strengths and using assets in local communities to achieve individual and shared goals that improve their wellbeing and quality of life.	£49,809.40
BGfm Community Radio	The money that has been awarded will go towards staffing a volunteer support officer. This position will enhance volunteering opportunities with our future plans to install a second studio to help train and encourage more engagement with each other. In order to develop the centre, we need a volunteer base to help deliver projects that meet the community's needs.
